I would like to formally request the use of Reeves, E. (2022). Content Area Literacy Grounded in Texas Standards. Kendall Hunt. ISBN 978-1-792-48610-4. The text will be used for READ-6293-X20/READ-6293-DX1/READ-4273-DX1/READ-4273-X20 Content Reading in the fall of 2023. Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes/Course Competencies Students will demonstrate the skills needed to use a wide range of curriculum materials in effective reading instruction for learners at different stages of reading and writing development and from differing cultural and linguistic backgrounds. The textbook directly aligns with the course objectives and the Texas Standards that pre-service teachers must meet. The textbook costs \$160.00 at the MSU Bookstore and \$115.50 directly from Kendall Hunt. The book includes 14 chapters and online features such as interactive pre and posttests, practice constructed responses for the TExES exam, and video lectures for each chapter.

#### Competing textbooks are:

 None – this is why I have worked to develop the text. There is currently no other book on the market for content reading grounded in Texas Standards to support our Texas preservice teachers.

The textbook seems appropriate for the content reading classes that are taught at Midwestern State University. It is not only readable and interactive but also directly supports WCOE objectives to train pre-service teachers in Texas.
