CAEP Measure 3: Candidate competency at completion

The majority of West College of Education advanced program candidates are required by the state of Texas to take and pass a minimum of one exam in order to be certified. School counselor candidates take the TExES School Counseling exam and educational diagnostician candidates take the TExES Educational Diagnostician exam. However, principal candidates are required to take and pass two exams. The first is the TExES Principal as Instructional Leader exam and the second is the Performance Assessment for School Leaders (PASL). Below are the resulting pass rate data for each of the programs' exams for academic year 2020-2021.
