

RESEARCH DATABASE

JSTOR is a digital library that contains full-text scholarly journals in the humanities, social sciences, and sciences.

Moffett Library subscribes to the following JSTOR Collections: Arts & Sciences I, Business, and Language and Literature.

JSTOR does not contain current articles; journal issues are typically added to **JSTOR** two to five years after publication in what is referred to as a "moving wall," which is the gap between the most recently published issue of a journal and the date the most recent issues are available in JSTOR. It is a great source for older articles, as some journals go back as far as the 1800s.

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS

By mid-November 1918, Germany had lost its allies, was suffering from depleted resources on the battlefield, and growing discontent among its soldiers and the homefront. The end was nigh and Germany finally began to seek an armistice with the Allied Powers on November 11, 1918. This armistice signaled the end of "The Great War," also known as World War I.

As part of the Headlines that Shook the World Series, a Special Mail Edition of The Minneapolis Journal from November 11, 1918, is available for viewing in Special Collections. The Series is part of the Nolan A. Moore III Heritage of Print Collection and documents important historical events through newspapers from 1764-1991. You can discover the newspaper issues included in the Series from the Moffett Library Search.

INTERLIBRARY LOAN SERVICES

With our Interlibrary Loan (ILL) services at Moffett Library, patrons can submit requests for materials such as books, articles, DVDs, etc. not held at the university library.

Not Sure How It Works? We're Happy To Help.

Login to your MSU ILLiad account at any time to make requests. First-time users will be asked to fill out a brief registration form before using ILLiad. You will also need this account to track requests, and access articles that you have received.


When you make a request on ILLiad, we act as an intermediary. We identify libraries with the desired item, place the request, receive the item, make it available to the user, as well as arrange for its return.



The lending library usually sets a due date and overdue fees for the material borrowed. Although books and journal articles are the most frequently requested items, some libraries will lend audio recordings, video recordings, maps, sheet music, and microforms of all kinds. In some cases, nominal fees accompany the interlibrary loan services.

Who Can Use The Interlibrary Loan Service?

Midwestern State University students, faculty, and staff may use this service free of charge. If you are not affiliated with MSU, please use your local public library for interlibrary loan requests. **Please note weekend requests after 5 p.m. on Fridays will not be processed till the next business day.**



Note for Faculty: If you would like someone else to pick up your ILL items on your behalf, please notify the Interlibrary Loan Department at ill@msutexas.edu or 940-397-4091. Authorized users can be added to your ILLiad account. A valid ID will be required to pick items up.



ILL Pick Up Policy



Scanned articles will be provided in PDF format for pick up via users' ILLiad account. Notification of the item's availability and instructions for viewing will be sent to the email address on file.

Books, microforms, and audio/visual materials can be picked up at the Circulation Desk in Moffett Library. A valid ID card must be presented to pick up materials.

Users will be notified by email when an item is available or if there are any issues with fulfilling a request.
