ADMISSIONS CHECKLIST

- Apply online at **www.applytexas.org**.
- Pay application fee of \$40. (Nonrefundable and nontransferable)
- Submit official SAT/ACT test scores to MSU.
 MSU codes: SAT 6408, ACT 4132
- Submit official high school transcript.
 Official high school transcripts must include STAAR/TAKS scores.
- Submit official college transcript(s) if applicable.
- Apply for financial aid by completing the FAFSA online at **fafsa.ed.gov.**

FRESHMAN CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

Successful completion of one of the following high school curriculum plans:

- Recommended High School Program
- Advanced High School Program
- Distinguished Achievement Program on the Foundations Plan
- Texas Foundations Plan plus an Endorsement

Completion of Algebra II in high school is strongly suggested.

Students who have not successfully completed one of the curriculum programs above must show successful completion of a high school curriculum that is equivalent in content and rigor or satisfy College Readiness Benchmarks.

Students who did not successfully complete one of the above curriculum plans AND who have not met the College Readiness Benchmarks may complete the HB 3826 Exemption Form and submit for review.
